## ACSH e-panel session on "Digital Practices and Solutions to Respond to the COVID-19 Induced Challenges in Governance" within the framework of the IIAS e-Conference 2020 24 June 2020

**Background:** COVID-19 pandemic is one of the greatest challenges faced by governments around the world. It is a time the public sector plays a crucial role in responding, mitigating, and helping resolve the crisis. In this vein, the effectiveness of public administration is of primary importance.

Apparently, the pandemic has led a completely new reality, introduced drastic changes in public sector of many countries. The new reality is characterized by a change in targets and values, swift and effective government decision making, an emergency transition of business processes to a digital platform and agile planning.

Innovative approaches and mechanisms were developed by the governments while they have been working through telecommuting in order to reduce the spread of the virus. This is the first experience for many civil service systems that challenged the traditional bureaucratic form of organization. Now, the ultimate and digital solutions against the pandemic can be developed only through joint efforts and exchange of best practices for the well-being of the society.

The Astana Civil Service Hub (ACSH)<sub>1</sub>, following its mission and the abovementioned reasons, is organizing a panel session on "**Digital Practices and Solutions to Respond to the COVID-19 Induced Challenges in Governance**" within the 2020 e-Conference of the International Institute of Administrative Sciences<sub>2</sub> (IIAS).

The first online Conference of the IIAS will take place on June 23-26. The e-Conference will focus on Climate Action after the Crisis, Governance of the Pandemic, take stock of the SDG agenda, and be devoted to IIAS activities including new projects and publications, governance meetings, and anniversary celebrations.

**Objectives:** The online session aims to bring together practitioners of the ACSH's P2P learning alliances on e-Government to discuss innovative measures taken against the pandemic, impact of the public innovations and e-solutions to mitigate the spread of the virus. This e-panel session will enable the participants to learn innovative practices of Azerbaijan, Estonia, Kazakhstan, and OECD countries' applied during the pandemic. It is designed to assist the decision makers to come together, explore faced challenges, learn from one-another and find innovative solutions for overcoming the Covid-19 related issues.

**Audience:** e-Conference participants, including practitioners, academia as well as e-Government development professionals from the ACSH participating countries, partnering professional associations and international institutions.

ACSH is a multilateral platform for continuous exchange of experience and knowledge in the field public administration and public service delivery among its 42 participating countries and more than 70 institutional partners from different parts of the world.
