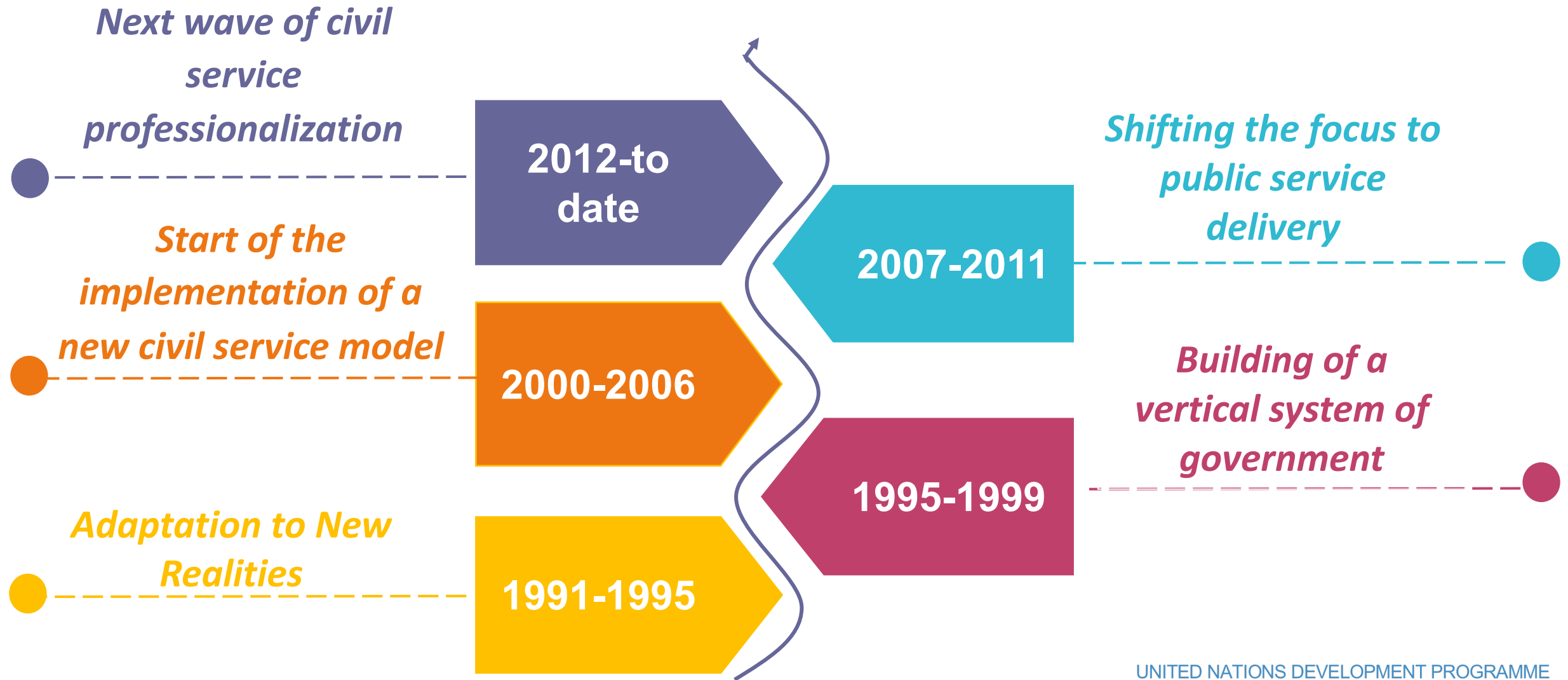

1991-1995

- 💡 Renaming the former executive bodies
- 💡 Establishing several new structures related to the functions of an independent state

- 💡 Changes to the political and administrative systems of the country according to The Constitution in 1995

- 💡 The Decree of the President of the Republic of Kazakhstan On Civil Service

- 💡 The Government Strategy "Kazakhstan-2030" in 1997

- 💡 The Agency for Civil Service Affairs, 1998

- 💡 The Law on Civil Service, 1999

- 💡 The Anti-Corruption Law, 1998

1995-1999

Building of a vertical system of government

2000-2006

- 💡 Public positions have been divided into political and administrative
- 💡 The open competitive selection became mandatory
- 💡 The protection of professional civil servants is put in The Civil Service Law.
- 💡 And other measures

- 💡 'One-Stop Shop' Public Service Delivering Centres
- 💡 The development of e-Government
- 💡 The introduction of the Executive Secretary position
- 💡 The development of Civil Servants' Performance Appraisal System
- 💡 The introduction of State Bodies Performance Evaluation System

date

- 💡 The creation of the Corps “A”
- 💡 The strengthening of the principle of meritocracy and the role of competitive selection
- 💡 The enhancing of the role and status of HR Departments and the introduction of an automated system “e-kyzmet”
- 💡 The strengthening of ethical standards and introduction a new position “ethics commissioner”
- 💡 The adaption of a new Law on Civil Service in Kazakhstan according to “Plan of the Nation - 100 Concrete Steps”
- 💡 The development of a Unified Competency Framework
- 💡 The development of a new approach for remuneration
- 💡 The adoption of the Law “On Public Services” of 2013
- 💡 Etc.
