THE SELF-PACED ONLINE COURSE

The webinar will be followed by a self-paced online course that will provide the participants with the opportunity to gain a better understanding and enhance their capacities to plan and implement a digital government strategy through learning about digital government policies, innovative digital government services, and best practices of the Korean digital government, as well as about lessons learnt.

The self-paced online course will be on the Google Classroom platform, customized for the purpose. The course will be in English with Russian subtitles. It consists of eight modules. Each module includes a lecture video (15-20 mins) – delivered by a Korean expert – a power point presentation summarizing the lecture along with some references for additional reading.

PARTICIPANTS

High-level officials, policy makers from the seven participating countries responsible for digitalization and innovation in governance, who will share their insights on digital government policy and issues that can be reflected in domestic policy areas related to civil service, public service delivery, economic development, social infrastructure, etc.

COURSE EVALUATION

Such project proposals will be further discussed and improved during the study visits to Korea in the course of 2022 and 2023, and those that qualify may receive funding from the Korean Government to proceed with their implementation.*
